Step By Step

- · Chop tomatoes and transfer them to a large bowl.
- · Finely chop seeded bell pepper and jalapeños. Finely chop the onion and transfer all your veggies to the bowl.
- Dice the peaches. I liked the slightly larger dice for peaches to give them more of the center stage in this salsa. No need to peel them. You won't notice the peels and the color is prettier with the peel on. Transfer peaches to your bowl.



- 1 lb tomatoes, diced
- 1 bell pepper (4 oz), seeded and finely diced
- 2 jalapenos, seeded and finely diced
- 1 medium onion, finely diced
- 11/2 lbs peaches, diced
- 1/2 bunch cilantro, chopped
- 2 Tbsp lime juice
- 1/2 tsp salt, or to taste
- 1/4 tsp freshly ground black pepper or to taste





Add 1/2 bunch chopped cilantro, 2 Tbsp lime juice, 1/2 tsp salt and 1/4 tsp pepper. Add more salt and pepper to taste if desired. Fold everything together until well mixed and enjoy!

Pam Cheney, Administrative Director and Teacher with the Pacific School of Dance reached out to local artist, Josie Keating and together they brainstormed ideas for the
